What is the Peer Support program?

The Peer Support program provides students with a supportive environment where children and young people develop skills, understandings, attitudes and strategies to improve their mental, social and emotional wellbeing.

Positive relationships are developed across the school through a series of engaging activities with a range of students of all ages.

The program enables participating students to contribute in an environment where all can join in.

Those students helping to lead the program also gain leadership skills.

How does Peer Support work?

Our students will meet in small, mixed level groups across 4 sessions will run for about 1hr using materials from Peer Support Australia. Peer Support Australia's mission is to provide an evidence based, peer led approach to enhance the mental, social and emotional wellbeing of young people.

Peer Support has trained our staff and our staff have trained our student Peer Leaders to run supervised sessions to develop protective factors and strengthen positive relationships across the school. Peer Leaders will work with small groups of Foundation - Year 4 students. Our Year 5 & 6 students lead the sessions with the supervision of a classroom teacher.

Our 2025 Unit: Keeping Friends

This module supports students to develop the skills, knowledge and attitudes necessary to maintain friendships and interact with one another in a friendly and positive way.

Keeping Friends focuses on developing the following skills:

- critical thinking
- empathy
- conflict resolution
- assertiveness
- relationship building

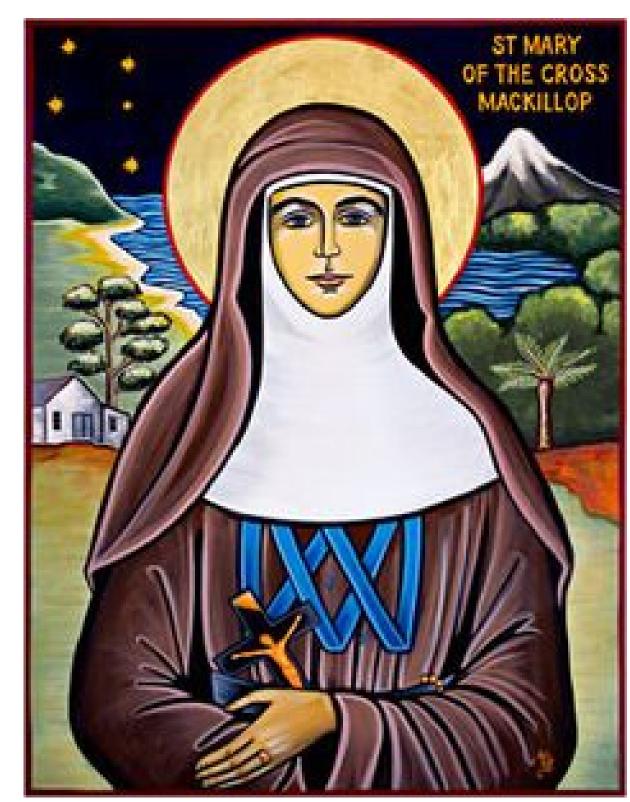
CELEBRATING THE FEAST OF SAINT MARY MACKILLOP

This week, our school community gathered to celebrate the Feast of Saint Mary MacKillop, Australia's first saint and a woman whose life was marked by deep faith, courage and compassion.

Mary MacKillop was born in Melbourne in 1842 and died in Sydney on 8 August 1909. Taking the religious name Mary of the Cross, she recognised the urgent need for education among poor and isolated children in the Australian colonies. In response, she founded the Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart, women devoted to teaching and serving those most in need.

Mary placed her trust in God's providence and pioneered a new way of religious life, choosing to live simply among the people, especially the poor and those on the margins. Her life was characterised by perseverance, humility and a deep desire to follow God's will in all things.

Her commitment to Catholic education, her care for the vulnerable and her belief in the dignity of every person have left a legacy that continues to inspire. Today, the work she began lives on through the Sisters of St Joseph and all those who share her mission. Mary MacKillop's well known words, "Never see a need without doing something about it," remain a challenge and inspiration to us all. As we reflect on her life, may we be encouraged to trust in God's guidance, walk gently with others and respond generously to those in need.

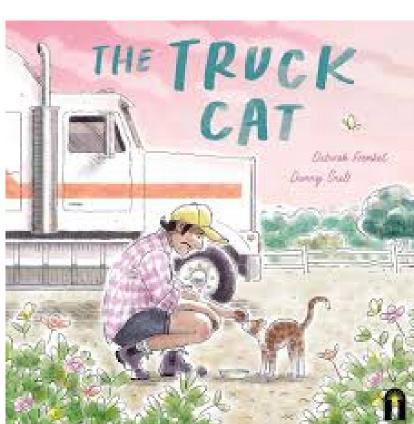

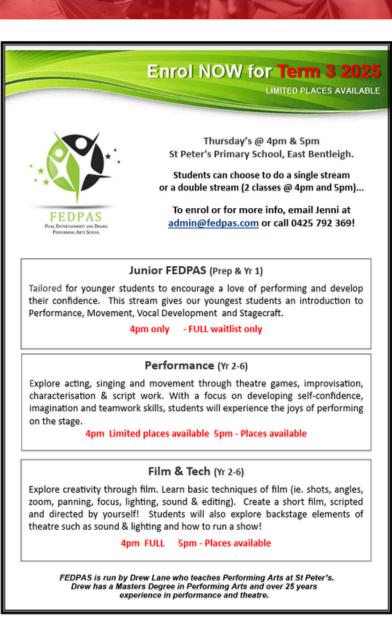
Performing Arts

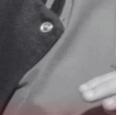

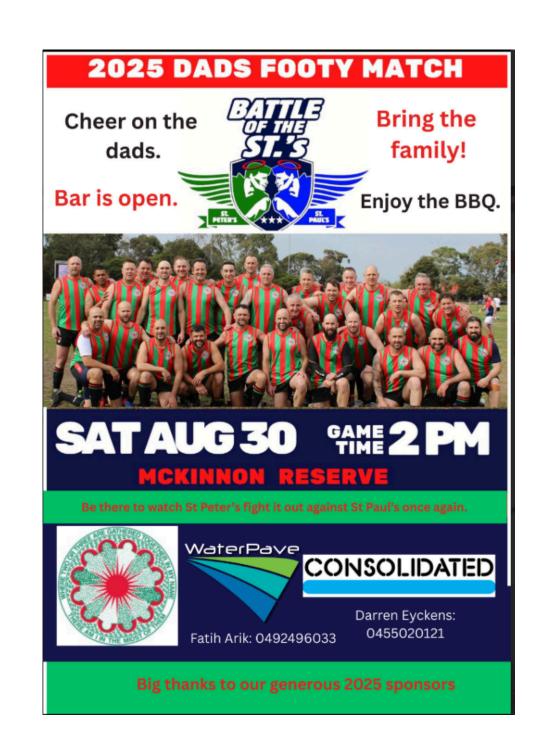

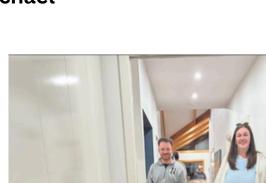
